<b>2784.</b>	<b>DEMOCRATIC TIME.</b>  A parishioner enquired as to where the traffic will go when the work is carried out in the High Street. Cllr. Grundy advised that the work will be taking place on the 27 <sup>th</sup> October and the Parish Council will get plans within the next couple of weeks hopefully. Highways are going to try and divert HGV's down the A12 and A130. The road will be closed between the Post Office and The Cock. The Chairman advised that until the Parish Council sees the proposals they cannot comment. The parishioner stated that Smallgains Lane will not be able to take the volume of traffic. The Chairman said that they will do what they can to restrict HGV's from using Smallgains Lane.  A parishioner commented on the hedges in Smallgains Lane. He said that he does not mind cutting the hedges but why does it always to apply to Smallgains Lane and what about the other lanes that are overgrown. The Chairman advised that if a complaint is received the Parish Council will make comment and write to the landowner. Cllr. Millernas advised that ECC were in Back Lane taking pictures of overgrown trees and hedges and were going to be writing to the residents and giving them 14 days to carry out the work.

	<p><b>Community Speed Watch</b> - It was reported that the scheme was working well and the volunteers had been out this morning. Cllr. Woodward advised that last Friday they had only seen 2 cars. Cllr. Grundy reported that a police car had been parking in Mill Road near Thornton Place which may be helping with speeding. Cllr. Woodward asked whether he could carry out Speedwatch at 6.30am - this was agreed.</p>	
2790.	<p><b>MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES.</b></p> <p><b>Potholes</b> – Highways had advised the Clerk that they are aware of the condition of the carriageway in School Lane Stock. They are pleased to report School Lane, has been selected as part of the additional £11 million for pothole repair within Essex; it is the intention of their Engineering Team to carry out repairs on all the carriageway defects on School Lane, within their investigatory level. A jet patching technique will be used on these carriageway defects; the jet patcher provides a sprayed bitumen/aggregate pothole repair. They regret they are unable to provide a date when the repairs will take place as work are in the process of being programmed, but would like to assure the Parish Council of their intention to carry out works on this road in the future. The first phase of the programme runs from July to October and they will target the outstanding defects they are aware of across Essex. The second phase of work will start in November 2012 and will focus on strengthening the road network to ensure fewer potholes occur in the longer term.
