## **MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON MONDAY 24<sup>TH</sup> FEBRUARY 2014 AT STOCK VILLAGE HALL, COMMON ROAD, STOCK AT 7.30PM.**

<b>3041.</b>	<p><b>DISCUSSION WITH CLLR. ROY WHITEHEAD, LEADER OF CHELMSFORD CITY COUNCIL.</b></p> <p>The construction of the Flood Alleviation Scheme is to commence soon. Cllr. Whitehead advised that a footpath is being put in from Galleywood to the Heritage Centre. This is due to be completed by the end of October.</p> <p>The development at Temple Farm was discussed. The Chairman advised that he had visited the Jehovah's Witness Centre in Mill Hill with Cllr. Grundy. JW's are proposing a public museum and this is concern as to the amount of visitors it will attract and traffic generation through Stock. The Chairman advised Cllr. Whitehead that the Parish Council had carried out surveys which revealed that the majority of traffic coming through the village was travelling at over 36mph and the PC are keen for average speed cameras to be installed. Cllr. Whitehead advised that City Council were quite supportive of the application and he hopes there will be a traffic scheme in place for Stock associated with the JW development. The Chairman felt the development was going to have quite an impact on landscape and views due to the scale of the development. Cllr Whitehead's view was that environmentally the site is a "disaster" and what is proposed would be an improvement. The Chairman said the site is was well screened at the moment. It was agreed that the Parish Council should seek S106 contributions from the development for the parish.</p> <p>The Chairman advised that there are a number of applications for very large houses on relatively small plots have recently been submitted and this was of concern to the PC given the visual impact these houses are likely to have on the character of Stock.</p> <p>The Council Tax paid to CCC for a band D property in Stock is £173.00 a year which is quite modest. CCC are trying to raise income in order to keep Council Tax down. They are trying to keep self sufficient to prevent needing a Government grant and are doing this through car parking, festivals etc.</p>	
<b>3042.</b>	<p><b>DEMOCRATIC TIME.</b></p> <p>A parishioner reported the potholes in Goatsmoor Lane. Cllr. Grundy advised that a traffic warning notice had been released today. Clerk advised it was for B.T. work not potholes. Clerk to report to Highways.</p> <p>A parishioner reported that the grass verge in Well Lane/Smallgains Lane has been churned up by about 2ft – 3ft. The Chairman asked Mrs Henderson to mark on a plan where posts should be in order that he could send it to Highways to deal with.</p> <p>A parishioner reported that flooding is still a problem in Smallgains Lane and that her gate has gone rotten where people keep driving through the flooding and it is spraying up her gate. Cllr. Grundy advised that there is a lot of discussion going on regarding flooding and who has responsibility. He advised that the Parish Council will be asked to list all ditches in the village in due course so they can be monitored and landowners can get involved to get the work done. Grundy felt the service should be brought to Stock and asked that the Parish Council put in a Parish Council request as he had also requested for it to be rotated between parishes.</p> <p>It was reported that the Almshouses track is getting bad potholes again. Cllr. Woodward to speak to Bob Hale.</p> <p>Cllr. Johnson reported that the drain needs to be looked at, at the west end of Back Lane. The verges are also being broken down and reflector posts should be put up. Cllr. Grundy advised that he was going to get a survey carried out.</p> <p>Cllr.
