Millernas reported that Back Lane had been partially repaired but there are still some potholes remaining.</p> <p><b>Bulb planting and sponsorship</b> – Clerk to chase CCC for delivery of bulbs.</p> <p><b>Pond at Thornton Place</b> – Conservation Volunteers had inspected the pond and are coming on 14<sup>th</sup> October to carry out the work. <p><b>CCC Local Highway Panel</b> – Cllr. Lee reported that ECC had put down their own markers to validate the Parish Council speed data.</p> <p><b>Drainage on Common</b> – The Chairman reported that a pile of soil had been left on the edge of the Common. The Cricket Club have enquired when Swift are to complete the works and want to know what will happen to the soil around the perimeter. The Chairman advised that the cost to remove the soil and remedial works to the existing mole drains is £950.00. It was agreed that this work should be undertaken. It was also agreed that the balance of the drainage works should be put on hold for the time being.</p> <p><b>Speeding</b> – Nothing to report.</p> <p><b>Broken Marker Posts in Smallgains Lane and Well Lane</b> - Nothing to report.</p> <p><b>Resurfacing of Church Car Park</b> – The Chairman asked the Clerk to complete the Community Initiatives Grant form. The Clerk advised that the Parish Council may have missed the deadline and if so she would look into what other grants are available.</p> <p><b>Knocked down posts in Church Car Park</b> – The matter was on-going.</p> <p><b>Storage Space at Heritage Centre</b> – The Clerk had spoken to Geoff Tully and no storage is available at the Village Hall. The Clerk had also spoken to the Secretary at Stock Heritage Society and advised her of the agreement between John Dixon and Jenny Berkley of a donation of £100.00 and the fact that the Parish Council would not be prepared to pay any more than £200 per year. Secretary to speak to Committee and come back to Clerk with their comments.</p> <p><b>Renovation of War Memorial</b> – Bob Hale was dealing with matter.</p> <p><b>Parish Noticeboard</b> - Cllr. Millernas dealing with matter.</p> <p><b>Clearing ditches around the village</b> – Conservation Volunteers to contact Cllr. Johnson to arrange a site visit. Cllr. Lee advised that the Flooding Investigation Team were talking about ditches and advised they need reporting. Cllr. Lee advised that she had requested, via Freedom of Information Act, information on the gullies in the village and what work has been done to them. It was agreed the ditches need to be looked at when it has rained and to make Highways aware of any problems. It was reported that Brook Farm floods every time and this has been taken up with Highways.</p> <p><b>Stone pathway from The Square to Paddocks</b> – Bob Hale dealing with matter.</p> <p><b>Play in the Park</b> - Event had taken place. The Chairman said a Risk Assessment will need to be done if the area becomes publicly accessible. 3142.	<p><b>GENERAL CORRESPONDENCE.</b></p> <p>a) Lynn Roberts of CCC advising that the site at 10 Common Road’s addresses are now 10 and 10A Common Road.</p> <p>b) Sue Moore of CCC advising a proposed disposal of a vacant social housing dwelling in Stock. The property is 1 Dakyn Drive and the reason for disposal is due to the property having a small concrete garden and adapted bathroom not conducive to family living. Numerous complaints have been received from previous tenants regarding the size of the garden. It was agreed the Clerk should write back advising that there is not enough social housing in Stock and the Parish Council are disappointed that Affordable Housing is being sold. They feel there is plenty of amenity land in Stock for people to use so the small garden is not a reasonable reason to sell the property.</p> <p>c) Mrs Aderyn Gillett of Essex Air Ambulance asking the Parish Council to continue their support of Essex Air Ambulance. It was agreed this letter would be held until the grants are made in November.</p> <p>d) Essex Playing Fields inviting the Parish Council to the AGM on 23<sup>rd</sup> October. Nobody wished to attend.</p> <p>e) CCC advising that the Council is mandatorily required to share information they hold about the Parish Council with the Audit Commission.</p> <p>f) Chris Fox of ECC Highways reporting that the vegetation adjacent to No. 27 The Square looks even worse than when he first approached the Parish Council asking for it to be cutback. As the vegetation is now significantly overhanging the highway and affecting both visibility and the carriageway surface he asked that the Parish Council look into making arrangements for it to be cutback cleared to behind the carriageway as soon as possible. He had spoken to James McCarthy who had a site meeting with a member of the Parish Council. He has advised them, as the works only really involved getting rid of the ivy and bramble, CCC do not require prior notification. Any works to the live wood would require six weeks notice. It was agreed the Clerk should ask Cllr. Woodward to deal with the matter and possibly ask Swift to carry out the work. Cllr.
